Engage fully with the learning: Don't just passively absorb the information. Ask questions, contribute to discussions, and actively seek clarification on anything you're unsure about. The more you put into it, the more you'll get out of it.

Reflect on your learning: Regularly take time to reflect on what you've learned and how you can apply it to your own context. Journaling, discussing with a colleague, or simply thinking about your experiences can help you deepen your understanding and identify areas for growth.
